

What is the Bible and where did it come from? The Bible says... that it is the inspired word of God. 2 Timothy 3:16 - 'All scripture is given by inspiration of God'. God selected men who were holy and feared him. God made his will known to them. These men wrote down the message they received from God. Look up and write down 2 Peter 1:21.

'For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the holy spirit'.

Why was the Bible written?

The Bible was written to teach us about God and his purpose, so we can live our lives the way God wants us to.

Look up and write down 2 Timothy 3:16-17.

'All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect,

What do we do with the Bible?

thoroughly furnished unto all good works.'

We need to study the Bible and find out for ourselves what is true.

Proverbs 2:3-6 - 'Indeed, if you call out for insight and cry aloud for understanding, and if you look for it as for silver and search for it as for hidden treasure, then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God. For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.'

'And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.'

How can we study the Bible?

By reading the Bible you will get to know the Bible.

The Bible is written in a way that allows us to look things up. (Study)

Always think about the what the Bible says in context. (Read the whole story)

Compare what you are reading in the Bible with other passages in the Bible.

Use a concordance - this helps you to understand what each word means.

Talk to others about the scriptures and ask questions.

Look up what others have said to see if it is true.


When you think... "That doesn't make sense!" that's when and what you should study.

Study 1—The Bible Strue? How do we know the Bible is true?

The Bible can not be proven wrong:

Many people don't believe the Bible so they try to prove the Bible wrong but they can't.

Prophecy proves the Bible true:

From time to time the Bible speaks of events that will happen hundreds of years later.

Over time many nations that the Bible talks about are no longer nations today, but the Bible says that the Jews would survive. The Jews are still a nation today. Many other nations have tried to destroy the Jews.

Jeremiah 30:10-11 - 'So do not be afraid, Jacob my servant; do not be dismayed, Israel, declares the Lord. I will surely save you out of a distant place, your descendants from the land of their exile. Jacob will again have peace and security, and no one will make him afraid.'

Look up and	write	down	Jeremiah	30:11.
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'I am with you and will save you,' declares the Lord. Though I completely destroy all the nations among which I scatter you, I will not completely destroy you. I will discipline you but only in due measure; I will not let you go entirely unpunished.' Look up and read Jeremiah 46:28.



How the Bible describes things before they were invented:

The Bible prophesies about the following things. How would you describe the following things to people who lived way before these things were even thought about?

How would you describe to someone that seas will get polluted?

The Bible describes it like this...

'Like dead man's blood...every living thing in the sea will die' (Revelation 16:3).

This is what God tells us is going to happen just before Jesus comes back. Years and years ago people had never seen anything like this; now we see it happening in different areas around the world.





How would you describe army tanks and guns?

The Bible describes them like this...

'Noise like chariots', 'leaping over mountains', 'like crackling fire', 'like a mighty army' (Joel 2:5).

How would you describe **Nuclear power?**


The Bible describes it like this...

'a great star', 'blazing like a torch', 'fell from the sky', 'waters turned bitter', 'many people died from the water' (Revelation 8:10-11).

This is another prediction that God has said will happen before Jesus returns.



Before TVs, satellites and the internet God knew that we would be able to see what is happening on the other side of the world without being there (Revelation 11:9).



Study 1—The Bible Lesson 3 What else can prove that the Bible is true?

Archaeology proves the Bible true:

Many of the old nations, cities and kings etc. referred to in the Bible vanished without a trace. For years and years there was no sign or evidence of them, making people believe the Bible was made up.

Archaeologists have uncovered many artefacts and inscriptions which confirm the Bible. These archaeology findings are in museums all around the world.

Some archaeologists started out to prove the Bible wrong but as a result of their discoveries, they ended up believing in the Bible.

Some Archaeologists have used the Bible to help them find new places to discover.

Science proves the Bible true:

In 1847 Ignaz Semmelweis discovered that washing hands after performing an autopsy and before examining pregnant woman reduced the number of woman dying after child birth.

God told his people to wash after touching something that is dead (Numbers 19:19).

Around the 1400's some people thought the earth was flat, but they soon discovered the earth was round.

The Bible tells us that the earth is round (Isaiah 40:22 - circle of the earth).

Before the invention of the telescope the only way to see what stars looked like was to look up. When you look up at the stars all the stars seem to look the same. Look up and write down 1 Corinthians 15:41.

'The sun has one kind of splendor, the moon another and the stars another; and star differs from star in splendor.'


The Bible tells us that each star is different. We can see from pictures from the Hubble telescope how different stars look from each other. Did you know there are stars out there that are way bigger than the earth. God calls each star by name (Psalm 147:4).

History proves the Bible true:

Josephus ben Matthias is the best known ancient Jewish historian. He recorded information about Jewish wars and the history of the Jewish people. In Josephus' book 'Jewish Antiquities' he tells us some important information about Jesus (Jewish Antiquities 18.3.3)

- Jesus was a teacher
- He did wonderful works
- He had a brother named James
- Jesus was crucified under Pilate
- He rose from the dead

Other records recorded in Josephus' writings which are also mentioned in the Bible are... John the Baptist, the Sadducees, the Sanhedrin, High Priests and the Pharisees.



The Bible:

The Bible is a collection of 66 books. The books are divided into 2 main sections:

The Old Testament and the New Testament.

There were around 40 different people who helped write the Bible.

It was written over a period of 1,500 years.

The Old Testament:

There are 39 Books in the Old Testament. It was written before the time of Jesus.

The Old Testament was written in the Hebrew language.

The History books:

Genesis = Tells us how God dealt with the first people.

Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy = Tells us how God called Abraham, made a covenant with him and his descendants. How he brought his descendants out of Egypt and gave them the land now called Israel.

Joshua - Esther = A record of the history of the Israelites and how God dealt with them.

Poetic books:

Job, Psalm, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon = Written as Hebrew poems. They contain many teachings about God's ways and the feelings and duties of man. Books of Prophecy:

Isaiah - Malachi = Tells us about God's holiness, wrath, grace and mercy. We can also read about prophecies regarding Christ's birth (Isaiah, Micah), Christ's sacrifice (Isaiah) and Christ's return (Ezekiel, Daniel, Zechariah).

The New Testament:

There are 27 Books in the New Testament. The New Testament was written after the time of Jesus. The New Testament was written in the Greek language.

Gospel records:

Written by four different people: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John = They all record Jesus' life and each one tells the gospel message in his own way.


Acts of the Apostles = Written by Luke. This book tells us what happened after Jesus was risen from the dead. It tells us how the first churches started.

Letters:

Romans - Jude = These were written by some of the apostles to help believers in the small young churches.

The book of Revelation = The last message. End-time prophecies.

Translations:


The Bible has been translated from Hebrew and Greek into many different languages. People all around the world are able to read God's word.

The English language has many different translations. They have been translated to suit the translator's way of thinking.

So how do we know what we are reading in our translation was written in Hebrew or Greek?

Thankfully some translators have also made concordances.

A concordance is a book which has every word in the Bible listed in alphabetical order. It can tell you what the word means and where you can find that word in the Bible.



How do we know there is a God?

Look around at creation - Do you believe that the earth just formed itself in the right spot?

Scientists now know that if the earth was just a little bit closer to the sun it would be too hot for us to live in. If the earth was a little further from the sun it would be too cold for us to live in.

There must have been something or someone who designed these things just right! But who?

We learnt in our last study that the Bible is true. It has been proven by Archaeology, Prophecy, Science and History. And the Bible tells us that God exists!

The Bible tells us... God is the creator:

Genesis 1:1 - 'In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.'

Isaiah 45:12 - 'It is I who made the earth and created mankind on it. My own hands stretched out the heavens; I marshalled their starry hosts.'

Look up and read Proverbs 3:19 and Jeremiah 10:12 and write down what God used to create the heavens and the earth:

'Wisdom', 'Understanding', 'Power'.



The Bible tells us... God is all-knowing:

God watches us and knows what we do... (Job 31:4, Psalm 33:13-15, Jeremiah 23:24). Look up and write down Psalm 139:2-3.

'You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar. You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with my ways.'

God knows what we think about and he knows what's in our hearts... (1 Chronicles 28:9, Psalm 44:20-21, Jeremiah 17:10, Hebrews 4:12-13, Jeremiah 16:17, Job 10:14).

God knows what will happen before it happens... (Isaiah 46:9-10, 42:9, Daniel 2:28). He knows what we will say... (Psalm 139:4).


He knows how many hairs are on our heads... (Matthew 10:30).

God is everlasting to everlasting (Psalm 90:1-2).


God is from all eternity (Psalm 93:2).



God's Purpose fulfilled:

God is going to wipe out sin and set up his kingdom. His kingdom will be a perfect place that fulfils everything on God's list.

The Kingdom of God will be a place where...

The world will be inhabited.

The whole earth will know God.

The whole earth is to be filled with God's glory.

All the earth will be filled with the glory of the Lord!



God's purpose for us:

God wants us to be a part of his kingdom. He calls us (2 Thessalonians 2:12). He chose us before the creation of the world (Ephesians 1:4). God's promise is to give eternal life to those who love him (James 2:5).

What does the Bible say sin is?

Look up and write down 1 John 3:4.

'Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness.'

Sin - is an offence, it is doing what is wrong.

Law - is a rule, a commandment.

Lawlessness - is wickedness and unrighteousness.

A sin is not doing what God asks us to do.

When we sin we are saying to God...'I will not do what you ask, but I will do what I want to do'.

How do we know what the law is (What are God's rules)?

We have learnt from above that a sin is going against the law or a rule (James 4:17). Romans 2:18 tells us if we learn what the rules are we can obey them.

As we read and study the Bible we learn more and more about God, his purpose and what he wants us to do. There are many examples in the Bible of how different people lived their lives; we can learn from their mistakes and try to do what they did that pleased God (2 Timothy 3:16, Psalm 119:11, Romans 15:4).

Is it easy to do what is right?

Our flesh is weak (Matthew 26:41) and we keep falling short of what God wants us to do (Romans 3:23).

We desire to serve our own lusts. We want to do what we want to do (James 1:14-15, 1 John 2:15-17).

We need to fight those desires. We need to stop doing what we know is wrong and do what is right. 1 Timothy 6:12 says 'fight the good fight of faith'.

Yes it can be hard to stop doing what we know is wrong. But if we fill our hearts with the things of God it will make it easier for us to make the right choices (Colossians 3:1, Romans 8:5, Romans 13:14).

Here is how Paul describes his fight against sin

'For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing.'

Paul didn't want to sin, he wanted to do what God wanted him to do.

What will be our choice?


We have a choice.

To follow God's way or our own way (Galatians 6:8, Joshua 24:15).

Study — Single — Share — What choice did Adam and Eve make?

What was God's rule in the garden?

God told Adam and Eve that they could eat from any tree in the garden <u>except</u> the tree of knowledge of good and evil.

God warned them 'for when you eat from it you will certainly die' (Genesis 2:16-17).

Adam and Eve had freewill; they could choose to be faithful and obey God, or they could choose to be disloyal and disobey God's command.

Eve understood this rule and the punishment that would come from disobeying. Look up and write down Genesis 3:3 to see what Eve said;


'But God did say, You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die.'

The serpent told Adam and Eve that they wouldn't die if they ate from the tree, but they would be like God knowing good and evil.


Why did Adam and Eve disobey?

We desire to serve our own lusts. 1 John 2:16 tells us that we have 'the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life'.

In Genesis 3:6 Adam and Eve chose to disobey because...



'the fruit of the tree was good for food' - Lust of the flesh 'and pleasing to the eye,' - Lust of the eyes 'and also desirable for gaining wisdom' - the pride of life



What was their punishment?

The punishment for eating from the tree of knowledge of good and evil was death - 'you will certainly die.' Genesis 2:17

Adam and Eve sinned. They are from the tree of knowledge of good and evil and now they have to be punished (You can read the whole punishment in Genesis 3:8-21).

"...for dust you are and to dust you will return." Genesis 3:19.

Adam and Eve were made from the dust of the ground (Genesis 2:7) and now God is telling them that they are going to return to the dust.

When we die we cease to exist and we decompose back to dust.

What happens if we sin?

'And the Lord God commanded the man, You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will certainly die Genesis 2:16-17.

The Bible tells us that if we choose to sin; we will die. Punishment for sin is death. Romans 5:12 'Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned—'.

Ezekiel 18:4,20 'The one who sins is the one who will die'.

James 1:15 'after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death.'



Study 8 – Singlesson 4 Is there any hope for us?

We all Sin:

Sin is not doing what God asks us to; but to do what we want to do.

Everybody sins, it's in our nature; sin makes it hard for us to stop doing what we want and to do what we know is right (Romans 7:14-20).

The punishment for sin is death:

We know that the wages of sin is death.

When we are dead it's too late. We can't praise God (Psalm 6:5, 115:17) and we don't know anything, our plans die with us (Ecclesiastes 9:5-6, Psalm 146:3-4).

God is merciful, loving, compassionate, gracious and forgiving:

God created us so that we could fill the earth with his glory.

God loves us so much that he doesn't want to see us die. He wants us to be saved! (1 Thessalonians 5:9).

Look up and write down John 3:16.

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.'

God sent Jesus to save us (John 3:16-17, Ephesians 1:7, Ephesians 2:4, Romans 5:8, Romans 5:21, Romans 6:23, 1 John 4:9-10).

Study 42-Jesus Lesson 1 Was Jesus promised to us by God?


The 1st promise:

God punished Adam, Eve and the serpent because they sinned. In their punishment he also gave them a promise. A promise that a saviour/messiah who could overcome sin would come and destroy sin forever.

Look up and write down Genesis 3:15.

The serpent's offspring is SIN, The woman's offspring is the one who will save us from sin; JESUS. Jesus will crush sin (killing it). Sin will only hurt Jesus, wounding him for a short time (dying on the cross).

What does Jesus' name mean?

Jesus is a Greek name that came from the Hebrew name 'Joshua'.

Joshua means "Yah (God) shall save".



What was Jesus like as a child?

When Jesus was 12 years old he and his family went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. After the festival, his parents started to return home. Jesus stayed behind, but his parents were unaware of it. They thought he was with them. They travelled on for a day before they realised Jesus was missing. They went back to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. Everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding and his answers. Look up and write down Luke 2:49.

'Why were you searching for me? he asked. Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?'

Jesus understood that he was God's son; he wanted to learn more about God and what the scriptures had to say.

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Study 49-Jesus Baptism and Temptations

Jesus was baptised:

Read Matthew 3:13-17.

What is Baptism?


It is to show everyone that you 'want' to do what God wants you to do.

There are 3 steps to getting baptised...

- 1: Confess you sins = You need to understand that you are a sinner and that God's ways are right.
- 2: Repent from your sins = You realise that you don't want to sin. You want to follow God's rules.
- 3: Go under the water = Symbolises that you are killing your old self (bad ways) and are reborn as a child of God.

Look up and write down 1 John 1:9.

'If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.'

If Jesus never sinned, why did he get baptised?

John knew Jesus hadn't sinned but Jesus knew that being baptised was the right thing to do. After Jesus was baptised God told him how pleased he was with him.

Jesus is our example!

Look up and write down 1 John 2:6.

'Whoever claims to live in him must live as Jesus did.'

Jesus was tempted:

Read Matthew 4:1-11.

Just like Adam and Eve, Jesus could choose to do what was right or to do what he shouldn't.

After Jesus was baptised God lead him into the wilderness for 40 days. God wanted to test Jesus to see if he would use his power for his own pleasure and glory or for God's pleasure and glory.

Who or what is the devil?

The devil is the decision to go against what God wants us to do.

The word devil comes from a Greek word called 'diabolos' which means false accuser. The word 'diabolos' is made up of two words 'dia' and 'ballo' which means to strike or pierce through, cast over, throw out or throw down. If you were given a rule then you can choose to obey that rule or to strike (attack) the rule, pierce (cut) through the rule, cast over (ignore) the rule, throw out (discard) the rule or throw down (put aside) the rule.

Jesus' temptations:

Jesus' 1st temptation was to tempt his 'Lust of the flesh':

Jesus hadn't eaten for 40 days and 40 nights. He was hungry! He was tempted to turn stones into bread to satisfy his hunger. He fought that desire by using scripture: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'

Jesus' 2nd temptation was to tempt his 'Pride of life':

How cool would it be to show everyone that he was the son of God by jumping off the top of the temple knowing that God would send his angels to catch him. Jesus knew that this was wrong. 'It is also written: Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'

Jesus' 3rd temptation was to tempt his 'Lust of the eye':

Jesus knew that the earth had been promised to him and he now had the power to take possession of it. By doing so he would not have to go through the pain of the cross. Again Jesus fought with scripture: 'Away from me, Satan! For it is written: Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only'.

When God finished testing Jesus He sent his angels to look after him.

Study 49-Jesus Lesson 3 How did Jesus live his life?

Throughout Jesus' life; Jesus **TAUGHT** people about God and his **KINGDOM** (Matthew 4:17, Matthew 4:23, Matthew 9:35, Luke 6:20, Luke 9:11).

Jesus did many MIRACLES; he HEALED the sick (Matthew 9:35, Matthew 15:30, Matthew 19:2, Matthew 21:14, Luke 4:40).

And RAISED people from the dead (Matthew 11:5, Luke 7:12-15, Luke 7:22, John 12:1). God was WORKING through him (Acts 2:22, John 3:2, John 10:25).

Jesus showed **COMPASSION** (Matthew 14:14, Matthew 15:32, Matthew 20:34, Luke 7:13, Mark 8:2).

He **SERVED** others (Mark 10:45, Romans 15:3, John 13:3-5).

He was **OBEDIENT** (Matthew 26:39&42, Hebrews 5:8, Luke 2:51, John 5:30, John 6:38, Philippians 2:8 John 8:29).

He **FORGIVES** others (Luke 23:34, Acts 7:60, Acts 13:38, Romans 3:25, Colossians 3:13).

MEEK (Isaiah 53:7, Matthew 11:29).

And GOOD (Acts 10:38, 1 Peter 2:22).

Study 49-Jesus Lesson 4 Death and Resurrection

Jesus overcame sin: Jesus had the same sinful nature as we do, he was tempted in every way. Jesus chose not to sin, he always did what God wanted him to do. Look up and write down Hebrews 4:15.

'For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin.'

Jesus is our sacrifice.

By not sinning Jesus was a perfect sacrifice (2 Corinthians 5:21, 1 John 2:2).
Jesus died for our sins; (Ephesians 5:2).
He destroyed sin on the cross. (Romans 8:3).

Jesus couldn't stay dead!

Romans 6:23 says 'The wages of sin is death'. Jesus never sinned! And because he never sinned God raised him from the dead (Acts 2:24).

Jesus now sits at the right hand of God. Look up and write down Hebrews 10:12.



'But when this priest had offered for all time one sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God'.

Our hope:

Because one man sinned, death entered the world. (Romans 5:12). Jesus never sinned and through his blood we can be saved from death. (Romans 5:19). Look up and write down 1 Corinthians 15:22.

'For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive'.

God's Plan: From the very beginning, God planned to fill earth with his glory and peace. Look up and write down Habakkuk 2:14.

The Gospel:



Study 5 - The Kingdom Lesson 3 What will the kingdom be like?

How does the Bible describe the kingdom?

We need to rely on the Bible, because the Bible has been proven to be true so let's look at what the Bible tells us about the kingdom of God.

In the **KINGDOM** we will **LIVE** with **GOD** (Revelation 21:3, Leviticus 26:11-12, Ezekiel 37:27).

There will be no more death, suffering, crying, pain or sorrow. Our tears will be wiped away (Revelation 7:7, Revelation 21:4, Isaiah 25:8, Isaiah 30:19, Isaiah 35:10, Isaiah 61:13, Isaiah 65:18-19, 1 Corinthians 15:26, 52, 54, Jeremiah 31:13).

God's **GLORY** will be so **BRIGHT** that we won't need the sun or the moon (Revelation 21:11, Revelation 22:5, Isaiah 60:19-20).

The city is in the shape of a CUBE (Revelation 21:16).

The city is built on 12 foundation stones and each stone is a GEM. Each of the stones will have the name of the 12 apostles (Revelation 21:14, 19-20).

The city's walls will be high and built of jasper (Revelation 21:12, 18).

There will be 12 GATES; 3 gates on each side and the gates will be made of a solid PEARL, the gates will always be open. Each gate has the name of one of the tribes of Israel and will be GUARDED by an angel (Revelation 21:12, 13, 21, 25, Isaiah 60:11).

The city and the STREETS will be made of pure GOLD (Revelation 21:18, 21).

The only people who can enter the city will have their names written in the **BOOK OF LIFE** (Revelation 3:5, Revelation 21:27, Revelation 22:14, Ephesians 5:5, Galatians 5:21, 1 Colossians 6:9-10).

We will wear white clothes (Revelation 3:5).

We will be made like the ANGELS (Luke 20:35-36, Matthew 22:30, Mark 12:25).



Study 5 - The Kingdom? How can we enter into the kingdom?

We have to make the right choice:

To get into the kingdom we must choose one of two options.

The first option is the easiest choice. It is the choice many people choose; Jesus said 'Wide is the gate and broad is the road' (Matthew 7:13). In this option you get to do what you want to do. In this option you choose 'yourself'.

The second option is harder. Not many people choose this option; Jesus said 'Small is the gate and narrow is the road' (Matthew 7:14). In this option you choose to do what God wants you to do. In this option you choose 'God'.

When Jesus returns he is going to separate those who choose 'themselves' from those who choose 'God'.

To those who choose 'themselves' Jesus will say 'depart from me' and they will be thrown into the fire (Matthew 25:41 Matthew 13:42). This option leads to destruction (Matthew 7:14).

To those who choose 'God', Jesus will say 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father' and they will be able to enter the Kingdom (Matthew 25:34). This option leads to life and only few will find it (Matthew 7:14).

What should we do if we choose God?

We need to say sorry to God and try to do what God wants us to do.

This means we have to repent and change our ways. We must understand that we are sinners and we do things we know we shouldn't (Acts 3:19-20, Acts 17:30-31). Look up and write down Mark 1:15.

'The time has come, he said. The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!'

We must be reborn through baptism; being baptised shows everyone that you understand that you are a sinner but you don't want to sin anymore. You 'want' to do what God wants you to do (Galatians 3:27, 1 Peter 3:21).



After Baptism we need to change our lives:

Once we have chosen to follow God and have been baptised we need to change our lives to the way God wants us to live. We need to stop being foolish, stop stealing and work hard so we have something to give to others. Stop using filthy language and encourage others. Stop lying and being angry and become compassionate, kind, patient and forgiving. Sing to God and Thank him for everything (Ephesians 5:15-20, Romans 13:13-14, Ephesians 4:28-32, Colossians 3:8-25).



What do we do while we wait for the kingdom?

Love God with all your heart (Deuteronomy 6:5, Luke 10:27).

Seek first the Kingdom of God (Matthew 6:33, Luke 12:31).

In everything we do, do it for the glory of God (Colossians 3:23, 1 Corinthians 10:31).

Give thanks to God (1 Thessalonians 5:18, Colossians 3:17).

Talk to God in prayer (1 Thessalonians 5:17, Ephesians 6:18).

Read and study the Bible (Acts 17:11, 2 Timothy 3:16).

Encourage each other (1 Thessalonians 5:11, Hebrews 3:13).
